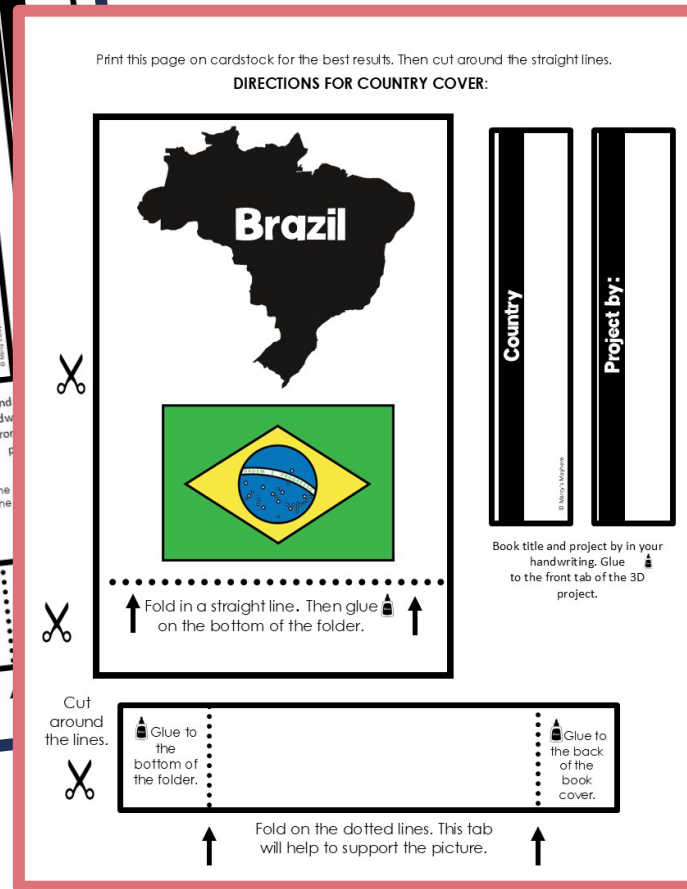
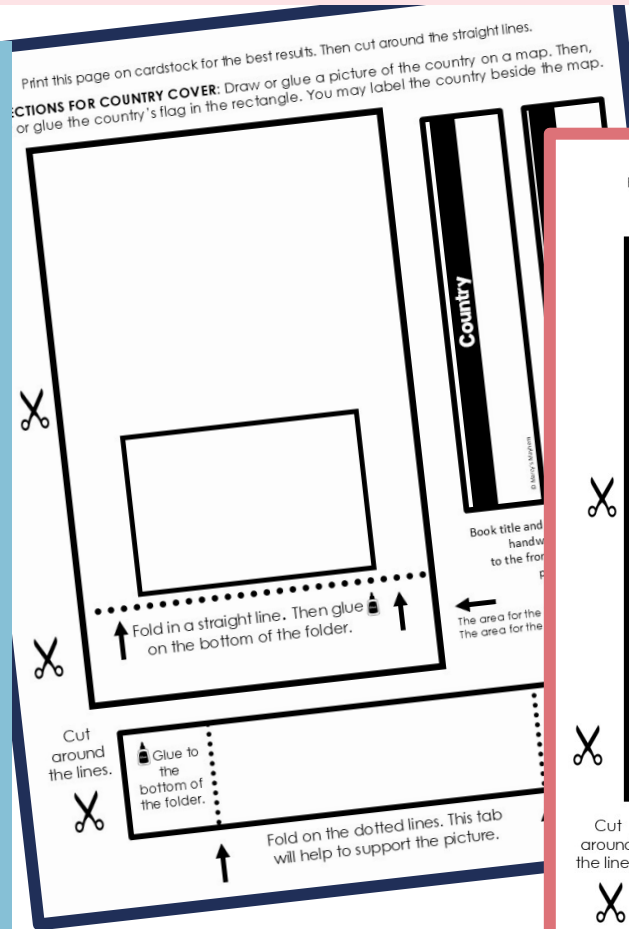



Design a Postcard






