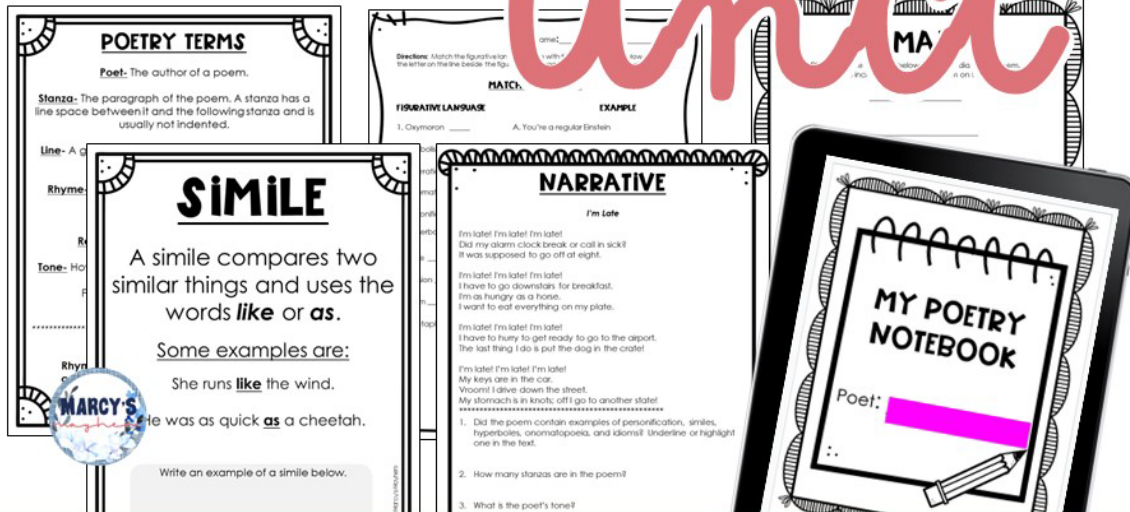

POETRY TERMS

Poet- The author of a poem.

Stanza- The paragraph of the poem. A stanza has a line space between it and the following stanza and is usually not indented.

METAPHOR

A metaphor compares two similar things and does **NOT** use like or as.

Some examples are:

She is the wind when she runs.

The boy is a cheetah.

SIMILE

A simile compares two similar things and uses the words **like** or **as**.

Some examples are:

She runs **like** the wind.

He was as quick as a cheetah.

FREE VERSE

Dog

The dog runs like the wind. (simile)
It hangs like a long slobbery slide, slurping.
(Alliteration)
It rides in the car as happy as a clam! (Simile)

Similes and Alliteration

CINQUAIN

A cinquain is a poem with five lines and a certain number of syllables per line.

1st line- 2 syllables
2nd line- 4 syllables
3rd line- 6 syllables
4th line- 8 syllables

HAiKU

A haiku is a poem with three lines with a certain number of syllables per line.

Line 1- 5 syllables

ACROSTiC

An acrostic poem is written from a word.

Coffee

Caffeine in the morning.
O pen my mouth to drink it up.
F ear me until I have my first cup.
F orming a smile after my first sip.
E very morning, it's the first thing I do.
E njoy!

RiDDLE

A riddle describes something without naming it.

It has four legs.
Car rides are its favorite.
Its breath is bad because it eats bones.
It loves to go on walks and play fetch.

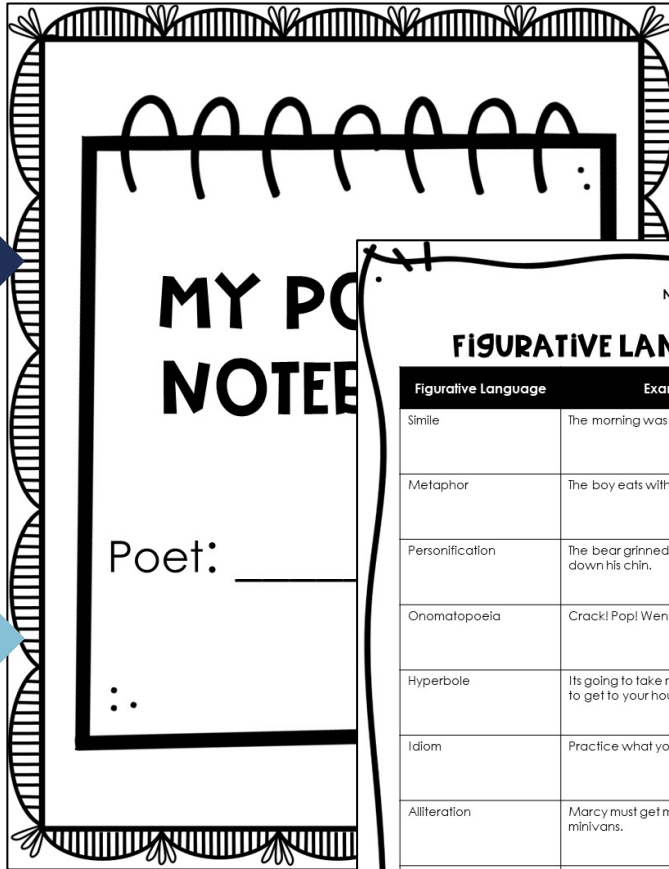

Simile	The morning was as cold as ice.
Metaphor	The boy eats with quickness.
Personification	The bear grinned as honey dripped down his chin.
Onomatopoeia	Crack! Pop! Went the firecrackers!
Hyperbole	It's going to take me a million years to get to your house in the traffic.
Idiom	Practice what you preach.
Alliteration	Marcy must get matching minivans.
Allusion	As the cruise set sail, he thought of the Titanic and hoped their trip would be safe.
Oxymoron	The plane made a crash landing in a field.
Symbolism	He reminded me of a snake with all his lies.
